## The PLEDGE Project Expands its Mandate

Canada-National, September 22, 2023 - The <u>PLEDGE Project</u>, an online database of large cast (6 or more characters) plays by Canadian women, is pleased to announce that it has expanded its mandate to also include plays by two-spirit, trans, non-binary, and gender non-conforming (GNC) playwrights. Pledge aims to provide theatre educators and practitioners with a resource to help redress inequities and promote greater access, diversity, and inclusion in post-secondary theatre training programs, and beyond. **Rebecca Burton** (Playwrights Guild of Canada) and **Barry Freeman** (University of Toronto Scarborough) created and co-lead the database project, which has grown from 100 large cast plays when first launched to over 500 plays to date.

Building on the PLEDGE Project's initial goal of showcasing and endorsing women playwrights, the new mandate will help promote plays by non-binary, GNC, trans, and two-spirit playwrights, since these communities have historically been marginalized and excluded from cultural representation. With PLEDGE, people can easily find and look at various works using the website's search and filtering features, which include play length, genre, theme, cast size, character identity categories, and the self-identifications of the creators.

Says Barry Freeman, "When we started this project, we didn't really know how many plays we'd find nor what the uptake would be in the community. It's been encouraging to see the database grow, and to be contacted regularly by producers and playwrights who see the site as one useful, accessible tool supporting the diversification of the repertoire of Canadian theatre schools."
